1. Information collected by the Firm.

- If the Firm is required to do so by law, such as to law enforcement agencies, courts, or others, in response to a subpoena, warrant, or court order.
- Where the Firm believes it necessary: to respond to claims asserted against the Firm; to comply with legal processes, such as subpoenas, warrants, or court orders; to enforce or administer the Firm's agreements and terms; for fraud prevention, risk assessment, or investigation; or to protect the rights, property, or safety of the Firm, the Firm's clients and customers, or others.
